Diploma in Applied Science: Major Expanded Duty Dental Assisting

2018 Admission Information

The Diploma in Applied Sciences with a Major in Expanded Duty Dental Assisting prepares the student to work closely with the dentist as a chair-side assistant, office manager, and laboratory assistant providing preventative and restorative care. The program is accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association. A program graduate may be eligible to take the Dental Assisting National Board Examination to become a Certified Dental Assistant.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The following courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better **prior** to admission into the Expanded Duty Dental Assisting program:
 - All Required Developmental Courses
 - All General Education Course Requirements
- 2. Students must have a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average (GPA) on all college courses to be considered for admission to the program.
- 3. Students must complete the check sheet for the ATC Expanded Duty Dental Assisting Program and submit to the ATC Admissions by May 25, 2018 to be considered for the Fall 2018 class. All information requested on the check sheet must be included or the application will be considered incomplete. INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMISSION TO THE EDDA PROGRAM.
- **4.** Student completing courses through non-ATC exemption exams should note that no points are awarded for successful completion of CLEP, AP or DANTES examinations.

CLINICAL PRACTICUM

Students are required to have reliable transportation to attend clinical sites during the summer semester. Clinical sites are located throughout the community.

A program graduate may be eligible to take the Dental Assisting National Board Examination to become a Certified Dental Assistant.

General Requirements (all required documents must be attached for consideration)

- Applicants must have completed all required general education courses, BIO 112, ENG 160, PSY 105 and MAT 101 with a grade of "C" or better prior to the application deadline.
- Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 (considering all academic course work, including
 prerequisites, within the last 10 years). Cumulative GPA will be calculated by ATC personnel upon
 receipt of application in accordance with the Health Sciences Division guidelines for GPA calculation.
- Credit is awarded for eligible Advanced Placement (AP) coursework, provided valid proof is provided of
 successfully passing the related AP exam. Credit is also awarded for non-ATC exemption exams such as
 CLEP or DANTES. No admissions points are awarded for high school AP credit or for successful
 completion of a CLEP or DANTES examination.
- A criminal background check is required prior to clinical rotations. Depending on the result of the background check, a student may not be able to participate in clinical and may be withdrawn from the program.
- Students may be exposed to blood-borne pathogens or infectious diseases when in the clinical setting and
 are required to follow written infection control protocol. Students may obtain a copy of policies associated
 with blood-borne pathogens and infectious disease by contacting the EDDA Program Coordinator, Mrs.
 Amelia Johnson.
- Once admitted to the program, students must submit documentation for each of the following:
 - o A physical exam (College form to be provided)
 - 2-step TB skin test or chest X-ray
 - o Hepatitis B vaccine series with antibody titer, or declination statement
 - o Proof of current immunizations
 - Current CPR certification (available at ATC/fee required)
- Once admitted, students are required to have reliable transportation for clinical rotations. Clinical sites are assigned and are determined by availability at medical facilities. Students are required to purchase uniforms for clinical experiences, have all supplies required, and be physically able to meet the clinical requirements.
- Once admitted, students must purchase liability insurance (cost will be added to tuition and fees).
- Applicants whose first language is not English must submit official TOEFL scores. A minimum score of 78
 on the computer-based exam is required to be eligible to apply to the program. English as a Second
 Language (ESL) courses are strongly recommended.
