Program Description:

The Associate of Applied Science in Nursing (ADN) program prepares students to take the examination for licensure as a registered nurse (NCLEX-RN). This two-year course of study includes nursing theory as well as supervised clinical experience at affiliated health care agencies. The Associate in Applied Science in Nursing program is accredited by the **Accreditation Commission for Excellence in Nursing** (3390 Peachtree Road NE, Suite 1400, Atlanta, GA 30326, Phone 404-975-5000, Fax 404-975-5020, www.acenursing.org).

General Information:

- Applicants must have completed all required prerequisite courses: ENG 101, MAT 120, BIO 210, BIO 211, BIO 225, PSY 201, and PSY 203, with a grade of "C" or better. Only the first or second attempted grades of the prerequisite courses taken within the last 10 years will be considered. The grade of a "W" or "WF" will count as an attempt. Please refer to the program display.
- Applicants to the LPN to RN completion program must have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 (considering
 all academic course work, including prerequisites, within the last 10 years). Cumulative GPA will
 be calculated by ATC personnel upon receipt of application in accordance with the Nursing division
 guidelines for GPAcalculation.
- Applicants must have graduated from a nursing program with a Diploma in Practical Nursing and
 possess a South Carolina Practical Nursing License that is in good standing with the Board of Nursing.
- Applicants may not have achieved less than a "C" grade (D, F, W, or WF) in any two previously taken nursing courses with in the last 5 years at any school (LPN or RN).
- Applicants must take the TEAS exam prior to application to the program. Points are only given for the
 math and reading sections. This standardized pre-nursing aptitude test is offered at the ATC Testing
 Center (803-508-7488). Please contact the ATC Testing Center for cost/schedule. The TEAS exam may
 be taken twice per academic year (August-July) with a minimum of 30 days between attempts. The
 testing date must be within 3 years of the application deadline.
- Applicants must take the ATI PN Comprehensive Predictor exam and achieve a minimum individual score of 69.3 percent. This standardized pre-nursing aptitude test is offered at the ATC Testing Center (803-508-7488). Please contact the ATC Testing Center for cost/schedule. The ATI Comprehensive Predictor exam may be taken twice per academic year (August-July) with a minimum of 30 days between attempts. The testing date must be within one year of the application deadline.
- Prior learning credit for Fundamentals of Nursing (6 credits) is awarded through exemption credit
 earned after the successful completion of standardized testing in NUR 201. Subsequent to initial
 admission, accepted students will be administered standardized testing. Successful completion
 must be achieved within the first two attempts to receive the (6) Fundamentals exemption credits
 and full admission into the LPN to RN transition program. Failure to successfully complete the

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standardized testing after the second attempt will result in withdrawal from all nursing courses and the nursing program within the first week of the semester with the ability to reapply to the program(s) without penalty.

- Credit is awarded for eligible Advanced Placement (AP) coursework, provided valid proof of successfully passing the related AP exam. Credit is also awarded for non-ATC exemption exams such as CLEP or DANTES. No admissions points are awarded for AP, CLEP, or DANTES credit.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must submit official TOEFL scores. A minimum score
 of 78 on the computer-based exam is required to be eligible to apply to the nursing program.
 English as a Second Language (ESL) courses are strongly recommended.
- Applicants must be physically able to meet the requirements of all clinical areas.
- After the application date has passed, all applications meeting the minimum requirement are
 reviewed by the Nursing Admissions Committee. Spaces are allotted to those most qualified as
 determined by the point system on this application. Notifications will be sent approximately six (6)
 weeks after the application due date.
- Candidates earning equal points are ranked based on their cumulative GPA.

Once Admitted

- A criminal background check is required prior to clinical rotations and repeated annually. Depending
 on the result of the background check, a student may not be able to participate in clinicals and may
 be withdrawn from the program.
- Students must ensure that all necessary official transcripts have been received by the College and submit documentation of the following: a physical exam, TB skin test or chest x-ray for previously positive TB skin tests, current immunizations, current American Heart Association (AHA) Healthcare Provider CPR certification, and annual drugscreening.
- Students are required to have **reliable transportation** for clinical rotations. Clinical sites are assigned and are determined by availability at medical facilities.
- Clinical rotations are required in Health Sciences and Nursing programs. Clinical sites may request students to follow protocols beyond what is required by Aiken Technical College, including COVID-19 vaccination.
